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Brian Laird, a pharmacy manager at OSF, says you should look at the label for instructions. But generally, avoid hot, cold or humid rooms. If your meds look damaged, call the pharmacy to see if they need to be replaced.

Also, don't leave the pills laying loose on the counter. A "by day" container is a good option.
